Hughes bags Rs 22.5 crore order from SBI, Sep 14 '09

Hughes Communications, a leading networking solutions provider, has informed that it has received a five-year contract worth Rs 22.5 crore from public sector lender the State Bank of India (SBI). The sources said that the order has been placed for deploying satellite broadband network to connect bank's off-site ATMs across the country.

As per the terms of the contract, Hughes will provide system integration, satellite bandwidth and network management services to SBI. Hughes will also offer secure VSAT-based connectivity to SBI with backhaul to the bank's Data Centre and Disaster Recovery (DR) locations.

In addition to this, about 2,000 ATMs are to be established by its associate banks (AB) and this rollout also forms part of scope for Hughes in this project. Being selected for the SBI project, all associate banks of SBI can now place order directly with Hughes for connecting their ATMs as well.
